



Main Motion F | School of the Year Finalist Cap

Whereas, currently the GLACURH Governing Documents states that the Regional Board of Directors (RBD) will be responsible for choosing six finalists who will then present during joint boardroom at the GLACURH Regional Leadership Conference; and,

Whereas, at the 2016 GLACURH Regional Leadership Conference (RLC) an excess amount of time was taken by discussing four School of the Year (SOY) bids; and,

Whereas, due to that excess amount of time used to determine the SOY award winner, other business had to be pushed aside; and,

Whereas, the Program of the Year category entrusts the RBD to choose two finalists who present during a special programming session; and,

Whereas, by decreasing the finalists cap for the SOY bid category to two, more time in joint boardroom can be spent on business related affairs;

Therefore let it be resolved, that by decreasing the finalists cap for the SOY bid category, time in joint boardroom can be more centered around business related affairs; and,

Therefore let it further be resolved, the RBD will be responsible for choosing two finalists for the SOY bid category who will then present in RLC Boardroom.

Therefore let it finally be resolved, that Title 9, Article XI, Section 1, Subsection F be amended as follows:

Section 1 School of the Year Award

F. Selection Process:

1. Bids will be presented in a written format with a ten minute formal oral presentation. Only a ten minute question/answer period will follow the Presentation.
2. The Regional Board shall be responsible for choosing ~~six~~ **two** finalists for School of the Year.
3. The Regional Board shall notify finalists prior to the conference. This information will then be posted in a manner which all NCCs and NRHH-CCs are able to view it. Finalist's bids will also be posted for download prior to the conference.
4. The selection process shall consist of a ten minute formal oral presentation per school, a ten minute pro/con session per school and a ten minute discussion period and shall be conducted at the Regional Leadership Conference business meeting. Recipients of the School of the Year award shall be determined by a majority of voting member schools in attendance at the business meeting at which the bids are presented. All votes will be by secret ballot.
