



Main Motion M | POY Process Update

Whereas, the GLACURH Regional Board of Directors is seeking ways to provide member institutions with more input on regional happenings, and;

Whereas, historically the Program of the Year process has allowed just RBD members to ask questions, discuss, and vote on bids, and;

Whereas, the timing of Program of the Year presentations causes CCs to choose between attending a GLACURH-U program or POY presentations, and;

Whereas, the timing of Program of the Year presentations prevents RBD members from presenting GLACURH-U programs, and;

Whereas, the processes for bid selection are already varied and can be confusing, and;

Whereas, aligning the selection process for School of the Year and Program of the Year will increase access to understanding regional processes and make bid processes more efficient, then;

Therefore let it be resolved, that Program of the Year presentations will still be open for any delegates of the Regional Leadership Conference to attend, and;

Therefore let it further be resolved, after presentations, each institution will have the opportunity to discuss and vote on the GLACURH Program of the Year winner, and;

Therefore let it further be resolved, that Title 9, Article XI, Section 2 be changed to reflect the following immediately following the closing of the Regional Business Conference.

	<p>A. Selection Process:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. The Regional Board shall be responsible for choosing two finalists for Program of the Year. b. Finalists for Program of the Year shall prepare a ten-minute oral presentation to be given at a meeting of the Regional Board of Directors during the Regional Leadership Conference followed by a ten-minute question and answer period. c. <u>The Regional Board shall be responsible for choosing two finalists for Program of the Year.</u> d. <u>Bids will be presented in a written format with a ten minute formal oral presentation. A ten minute question/answer period will follow the presentation.</u> e. Program Presentation at GLACURH Regional Leadership Conference suggestions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. What were the goals of the program? And how were these met? ii. Did students plan the program? Are students presenting the program? iii. Why was this program important to the campus? Did it solve any problems on the campus level? iv. How did this program relate to the campus population? Other campus populations? v. How many students did this program impact? vi. What was the cost of the program?



	<ul style="list-style-type: none">vii. How can this program be adapted to other campuses?viii. How chronological is the information being presented?ix. Is there audience participation/interaction in the presentation?x. Was the program presented in a professional manner?xi. Creativity of presentation: costumes, design of presentation, handouts.f. <u>The Regional Board shall notify finalists prior to the conference. This information will then be posted in a manner which all NCCs and NRHH-CCs are able to view it. Finalist's bids will also be posted for download prior to the conference.</u>g. <u>The selection process shall consist of a ten minute formal oral presentation per school, a ten minute pro/con session per school and a ten minute discussion period and shall be conducted at the Regional Leadership Conference business meeting.</u>h. <u>Recipients of the Program of the Year award shall be determined by a majority of voting member schools in attendance at the business meeting at which the bids are presented. All votes will be by secret ballot.</u>i. The GLACURH Program of the Year shall be determined by majority of the voting members of the Regional Board, by a secret ballot vote.j. <u>The award consists of a plaque to be retained by the winning school.</u>
