



**Main Motion - | Conference Philanthropy Alignment**

**Whereas**, the region is currently in year three of five of working with the current regional philanthropy, Ronald McDonald House; and,

**Whereas**, there has been very minimal involvement with the regional philanthropy from member institutions; and,

**Whereas**, conferences are the main avenue with which to generate involvement with the regional philanthropy through member institutions; and,

**Whereas**, each regional conference is allowed to select their own philanthropy, which, historically, has not aligned with the regional philanthropy; and,

**Whereas**, this process is counterproductive with the region’s goals of partnering with and working with a philanthropic organization for five-year periods; and,

**Therefore let it be resolved**, that Title 7, Article XIV, Section 2, Subsection E be created to read:

**Therefore let it further be resolved**, that Title 8, Article XVI, Section 1, Subsection G be updated to read:

**Therefore let it finally be resolved**, that these changes go into effect for conference host sites selected at the GLACURH Regional Leadership Conference 2018.
